

Membership Terms and Conditions

Enacted 22 August 2026 / Effective 22 August 2026
Operated by LINKS 22 (the “School”)

Chapter 1 General Provisions

Article 1 (Purpose)

These Terms set out the conditions of use of the football school, team activities and other programmes provided by the School (the “Services”), and govern the rights and obligations between the School and its members.

Article 2 (Definitions)

In these Terms, the following words have the meanings set out below.

- Member:** a person who has completed the enrolment procedure set out in Article 5 and whose enrolment has been approved by the School. For a person under 18, membership is established with the consent of a Guardian.
- Guardian:** the parent or legal custodian of a Member under 18 years of age.
- Ticket Classes:** classes operated on a prepaid ticket (class-pass) basis, namely Skill Lab, Skill Lab Basic, Mini, Kids, Junior, Girls, Social and Ladies.
- Monthly-Fee Classes:** classes for which fees are set on a monthly or termly basis, namely Next.
- Official LINE:** the School’s LINE Official Account, which serves as the formal channel both for notices from the School to Members and for contact from Members to the School.

Article 3 (Application of these Terms)

- Members and Guardians shall use the Services on the basis that they agree to these Terms.
- Provisions of these Terms that are applicable by their nature shall apply, with necessary changes, to trial participants, spectators and single-session (Drop In) participants.
- For special programmes such as camps, tournaments and overseas tours, separately issued programme rules apply in addition to these Terms. In the event of any conflict, the separate programme rules prevail.

Chapter 2 Enrolment

Article 4 (Eligibility)

- The age ranges for each class are as follows.

Class	Eligibility
Mini	Ages 3–5
Kids	Ages 5–7
Junior	Ages 8–12
Skill Lab Basic	Ages 5–10
Skill Lab	Ages 7–13
Girls	Ages 8–13 (girls)
Next	Ages 8–12, subject to passing the tryout
Social	Ages 18 and over
Ladies	Adult women

- No prior football experience is required.
- The School places no restriction on participating in other teams or schools at the same time.
- The School may decline an application for enrolment in the following cases.

- Where the class is full.
- Where the School judges that participation would be difficult for reasons of health or safety.
- Where the applicant has previously been expelled under Article 22.
- Where the School otherwise judges the application to be inappropriate.

Article 5 (Enrolment procedure)

- Enrolment begins with a trial application made via the Official LINE and proceeds as follows:
 1. apply for a free trial (Official LINE) → (2) confirm the trial date → (3) attend the trial → (4) apply for enrolment.
- Enrolment requires completion of the School's enrolment form and payment of the enrolment fee, the uniform fee and the tuition fee.
- Membership takes effect when the School has approved the application and confirmed receipt of the applicable fees.
- If any registered information changes (name, date of birth, contact details, emergency contact, health condition and the like), the Member or Guardian shall promptly notify the School via the Official LINE. The School accepts no responsibility for any disadvantage arising from a delayed notification.

Article 6 (Trial sessions)

- The first trial session is free of charge. A free trial is, in principle, limited to one session per class.
- Enrolment after a trial session is entirely optional; the School will never require a participant to enrol.
- Guardians are free to watch training sessions and matches.

Article 7 (Tryout)

Participation in Next requires passing the tryout conducted by the School. The School is unable to respond to enquiries concerning the selection criteria or the outcome of the tryout.

Chapter 3 Fees

Article 8 (Enrolment fee)

- The enrolment fee is THB 2,000, payable once on first enrolment.
- The enrolment fee is non-refundable for any reason.
- The School may reduce or waive the enrolment fee for simultaneous applications by siblings or during promotional periods designated by the School. The applicable conditions will be announced on each occasion via the Official LINE and the School's website.

Article 9 (Uniform)

- A uniform fee is payable on enrolment in addition to the enrolment fee.

Next	THB 2,000 (home and away kits)

- The uniform designated by the School shall be worn at training sessions and matches.
- Replacement due to an incorrect size, loss or damage is at the Member's expense.

Article 10 (Tuition fees for Ticket Classes)

- Tuition fees for Ticket Classes are as set out in the fee table on the School's website.
- Tickets are paid for in full in advance at the time of purchase and may not be refunded, transferred to another class, or transferred to a third party after purchase.
- One ticket is consumed per session attended. Attendance at a Sunday match (MatchDay) also counts as one session.

Article 11 (Ticket validity)

- Ticket validity runs from the date of first use, as follows.

Plan	Validity
12-session pass	6 months
8-session pass	4 months
4-session pass	2 months
Drop In (single session)	Day of use only

- Any unused sessions remaining after the validity period expire and will not be refunded or extended.
- However, where there are unavoidable circumstances such as prolonged illness or injury, repatriation or relocation, please consult the School in advance via the Official LINE. The School may, at its discretion, agree to extend the validity period.

Article 12 (Monthly-Fee Classes / Next)

- Tuition for Next is charged monthly according to the number of weekly sessions selected, as set out in the fee table on the School's website.
- Payment in full by term may be selected. The terms are as follows.
 - Term 1: September–December
 - Term 2: January–March
 - April: half-fee month
 - Term 3: May–August
- Benefits separately determined by the School (waiver of entry fees for tournaments held within Thailand, one make-up session per month, discounts on tour costs and the like) apply to termly payment in full. April (the half-fee month) is excluded from these benefits.
- Except where a benefit under paragraph 3 applies, no make-up sessions are provided to Monthly-Fee Class members for absences.
- Sibling discounts do not apply to Monthly-Fee Classes.
- Where a Member withdraws part-way through a month, the fee for that month is neither pro-rated nor refunded. Where there are unavoidable circumstances such as relocation or permanent return to the home country, please consult the School individually.
- Members may freely choose which days to attend, within the number of sessions contracted. A Sunday match day also counts as one session.

Article 13 (Payment)

- Fees shall be paid by the method designated by the School, such as bank transfer.
- Please report payment via the Official LINE once it has been made.
- Transfer charges are borne by the Member.
- All fees are denominated in Thai Baht.

Article 14 (Refunds)

The enrolment fee, uniform fee, ticket fees, monthly fees and termly tuition are non-refundable for any reason. This does not apply where the School is unable to provide the Services for reasons attributable to the School, such as discontinuation of a class at the School's convenience.

Chapter 4 Delivery of Sessions

Article 15 (Schedule and venues)

- The days, times and venues of each class are as set out in the schedule on the School's website.
- Venues are Noah Futsal Sukhumvit 26, TC Rama 9 and such other facilities as the School may designate.
- Match venues vary from occasion to occasion.
- The School may change session dates and times, venues, assigned coaches and class composition as necessary. Changes will be notified in advance via the Official LINE.

Article 16 (Absence)

- Please notify the School in advance via the Official LINE if a Member will be absent.

2. For Ticket Classes, no ticket is consumed by an absence. A Member may attend on another convenient day within the validity period.
3. Absences from Monthly-Fee Classes are governed by Article 12, paragraph 4.

Article 17 (Cancellation of sessions)

1. The School may cancel or shorten a session due to severe weather, natural disaster, closure of a facility, power failure, an infectious disease outbreak, government restrictions, sudden illness of a coach or other causes beyond the School's control.
2. As TC Rama 9 is a covered pitch, sessions there proceed as normal in the rain in principle. For outdoor venues, the School will notify Members via the Official LINE whether a session will go ahead in poor weather.
3. Air pollution (PM2.5) is handled as follows.
 - Where, three hours before the scheduled start time, the PM2.5 reading at the venue is 150 or above, the session will be cancelled.
 - Classes held at indoor venues such as gymnasiums are not subject to cancellation on PM2.5 grounds and proceed as normal.
 - Readings from the monitoring service designated by the School are used for this determination.
 - Where a cancellation is decided, the School will notify Members promptly via the Official LINE.
4. Where the School cancels a session, no ticket is consumed for Ticket Classes. For Monthly-Fee Classes, the School will arrange a make-up session by the method it separately determines.
5. The School bears no liability for refunds of tuition or for damages in respect of a cancellation caused by a facility malfunction or any other cause not attributable to the School.

Article 18 (Communications)

1. Communications from the School to Members are made via the Official LINE.
2. Members and Guardians shall add the Official LINE as a friend and maintain the ability to receive notifications.
3. The School accepts no responsibility for any disadvantage arising from a failure of notices to reach a Member, including where the Member has blocked the Official LINE.

Chapter 5 Suspension and Withdrawal

Article 19 (Suspension of membership)

Because Ticket Classes involve no fixed monthly charge, no suspension procedure is required. A Member may resume attendance at any time within the validity period.

Article 20 (Withdrawal)

1. A Member wishing to withdraw shall notify the School via the Official LINE.
2. Withdrawal from a Monthly-Fee Class must be notified by the last day of the month preceding the month of withdrawal. Where notification is late, the following month's fee becomes payable.
3. Unused tickets and tuition already paid are not refunded on withdrawal.
4. The enrolment fee may be payable again if a former Member re-enrols after withdrawal.

Article 21 (Lapse of membership)

Where a Member of a Ticket Class has not attended for 12 months or more since their last session, the School may treat that membership as having lapsed.

Article 22 (Suspension of participation and expulsion)

The School may suspend participation or expel a Member without prior notice where the Member or Guardian engages in any of the following conduct. Fees already paid are not refunded in such cases.

1. Breach of these Terms.
2. Failure to pay fees by the due date.
3. Violence, abusive language, bullying or harassment towards other Members, coaches or facility users.
4. Conduct contrary to the rules of a venue, or wilful damage to facilities or equipment.
5. Conduct damaging the reputation of the School or its coaches, including defamatory posts on social media.
6. False statements made at the time of application for enrolment.
7. Any other conduct that the School judges to be incompatible with membership.

Chapter 6 Safety and Health

Article 23 (Declaration of health condition)

1. Members and Guardians shall declare, at the time of enrolment, any pre-existing conditions, allergies, medication and other matters requiring consideration during activities, and shall promptly notify the School of any change.
2. Please refrain from attending where a Member has a fever, feels unwell, or is injured.
3. The School may, in light of a Member's condition during an activity, direct the Member to stop participating or to observe instead.

Article 24 (Equipment)

1. Members shall wear the designated uniform, footwear suitable for the activity, and shin guards.
2. To prevent heat illness, please bring your own drinking water. The School provides hydration breaks during activities.
3. Please follow the coaches' instructions regarding the wearing of spectacles, jewellery, watches and other items that may present a safety risk.

Article 25 (Injury and accidents)

1. The School conducts its activities with due regard for safety.
2. Where an injury occurs during an activity, the School will administer first aid, contact the Guardian as necessary, and arrange transport to a medical facility.
3. The medical facilities and emergency numbers the School will contact first in an emergency are as follows, by venue.

All venues	1669 (national emergency medical hotline)

Depending on the severity of the injury, transport times and other circumstances, a Member may be taken to a medical facility other than those listed above.

4. Where a Guardian cannot be reached in an emergency, the Guardian consents in advance to the Member receiving medical attention at the School's discretion. The cost of such treatment is borne by the Guardian.
5. The School bears no liability for injuries or accidents arising from a Member's pre-existing condition, an undisclosed health problem, failure to follow the coaches' instructions, or the acts of the Member or of a third party.

Article 26 (Insurance)

1. The School does not carry accident insurance for Members. Members and Guardians are strongly encouraged to arrange their own accident and medical insurance.
2. For overseas tours and tournament participation, the School may require travel insurance as a condition of participation.

Article 27 (Transport to and from venues; responsibility of Guardians)

1. The School's responsibility is limited to the activity area, from the scheduled start time to the scheduled finish time of the activity.
2. Transport to and from venues is the responsibility of the Guardian. The School bears no liability for accidents occurring at or around a venue outside activity times.
3. For pre-school and younger primary-school Members, a Guardian or their designated representative shall be present at the venue for handover.
4. The School bears no liability for the loss or theft of valuables or personal belongings brought to a venue.

Article 28 (No parent duty roster)

The School operates no duty roster, no committee roles, and no preparation or administrative work assigned to Guardians.

Chapter 7 Rules of Conduct

Article 29 (Prohibited conduct)

Members and Guardians shall not engage in the following conduct.

1. Failing to follow the coaches' instructions, or acting in a manner that compromises safety.
2. Violence, abusive language, bullying or discriminatory remarks towards other Members.
3. Conduct contrary to the rules of a venue, or damage to its equipment.
4. Conducting sales activity, solicitation, religious activity or political activity without the School's permission.
5. Providing, reproducing or repurposing the School's coaching content, session plans or materials to third parties for commercial purposes.
6. Disclosing the personal information of other Members or their families to third parties without permission.
7. Publishing photographs or video in which other Members are identifiable on social media or elsewhere without the consent of those Members.
8. Behaving inappropriately towards opposing teams, match officials or opposing supporters at match venues.
9. Any other conduct the School judges to be inappropriate.

Article 30 (Spectating and filming)

1. Guardians are free to watch and film training sessions and matches.
2. Please observe Article 29, item 7 in handling any photographs or video taken.

Chapter 8 Miscellaneous

Article 31 (Use of images)

1. The School may use photographs and video taken during activities in its promotional activities, including its website, Official LINE, Instagram, Facebook, YouTube and printed materials.
2. Members and Guardians consent to the use described in the preceding paragraph.
3. If you do not wish images to be published, please notify the School via the Official LINE at the time of enrolment or at any time thereafter. The School will refrain from any further new publication.
4. Even where such a request is made, the School notes in advance that removal from materials already published, such as printed materials and posts on external platforms, may be technically or practically difficult.

Article 32 (Handling of personal data)

1. The School handles personal data it collects in accordance with the Personal Data Protection Act of Thailand (PDPA) and other applicable laws.
2. Personal data is used within the scope of the following purposes.
 - Provision, operation of and communication regarding the Services.
 - Emergency contact and provision of information to medical facilities.
 - Billing and receipt of fees.
 - Provision to organisers to the extent necessary to enter tournaments and tours.
 - Sending information from the School.
3. Except as required by law or as necessary to achieve the purposes above, the School does not provide personal data to third parties without the prior consent of the data subject (or, for a minor, the Guardian).
4. Members and Guardians may request disclosure, correction, deletion or suspension of use of their personal data. Requests are accepted via the Official LINE.

Article 33 (No assignment)

A Member may not assign to a third party, or offer as security, their status or any rights and obligations under these Terms. The same applies to the transfer or lending of tickets to others.

Article 34 (Disclaimer)

1. In providing the Services, the School makes no guarantee as to improvement in a Member's ability, results in competition, selection to a higher category or any other outcome.
2. The School bears no liability where it is unable to provide all or part of the Services due to force majeure, including natural disaster, an infectious disease outbreak, political instability, measures taken by public authorities or closure of a facility.
3. The exclusions of liability in these Terms do not apply to loss or damage caused by the School's wilful misconduct or gross

negligence.

Article 35 (Amendment of these Terms)

1. The School may amend these Terms where it considers it necessary to do so.
2. Amended Terms take effect upon publication on the School's website and notification via the Official LINE.
3. Where a Member continues to use the Services after notification of an amendment, the Member is deemed to have agreed to the amended Terms.
4. Fee revisions will, in principle, be notified at least one month before they take effect.

Article 36 (Governing law and jurisdiction)

1. These Terms are governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Kingdom of Thailand.
2. Where a dispute arises between the School and a Member concerning the Services, the parties shall first seek resolution through good-faith discussion. Failing resolution, the courts located in Bangkok shall have exclusive jurisdiction as the court of first instance.

Article 37 (Language)

The Japanese text of these Terms is the authoritative version. The English, Thai and Chinese texts are reference translations. In the event of any discrepancy in interpretation, the Japanese text prevails.

Supplementary Provision

These Terms take effect on 22 August 2026.
